Hello, and welcome to the E-planning basics module on style sheets and builds.

In this module, I will focus on selecting style sheets and creating builds in preparation for publishing your project. My name is Utum Hong, I am an E-planning user representative with the BLM's National Operations Center in Denver, and I'll be your instructor for this module. At this point in the E-planning process, you should have the project created, written, and peer reviewed; however, before the project can be published, the style sheet must be selected for the documents. This process essentially formats the content for you. After that, the builds step will need to be selected, which compiles all of the project content, for example, photos, maps, and written material, into one specific location or file, from which that information can be displayed on your project website. Keep in mind that builds and style sheets will differ depending on the method you wish your content to be displayed. For example, web or PDF format will be viewed differently when compared to an interactive document format. These style sheets and builds are great features of the E-planning allowing you to focus on the content of your documents rather than the esthetics such as fonts, margins, and other formatting details. Upon completion of this module, you will know how to select a style sheet for your project and create builds for your project. You can follow along in the E-planning application while viewing this module either by toggling back and forth between E-planning application and this online course, or if you're lucky enough to have two computer screens at your desk then you can see them both at the same time. You can hit the pause button

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at any time if you need to practice what I'm describing, and then hit play again when you're ready for more. Let's begin with the style sheets and builds.
