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


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
- Prepared and distributed over 40 environmental fact sheets and recordkeeping forms.
 - Prepared and distributed environmental tool kit (98 pages) and resource manual (112 pages).
 - Prepared tailored pollution prevention, hazardous waste, hazardous materials, and hazard communication 2-hour training session.
 - Prepared 39 pollution prevention and hazardous waste survey reports with color photographs (approximately 50 pages each).
 - Prepared 7 forest survey summary letters with key color photographs and general findings.
 - Prepared survey team checklists (compliance and pollution prevention).
 - Fielded 2-person survey team; augmented by Regional RCRA manager.
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- Surveyed 7 forests, 6 forest supervisor offices, 3 national grasslands, 32 ranger districts.
 - Conducted classroom training for nearly 550 staff and seasonals; over 36% of identified personnel.
 - Identified several thousands of gallons of hazardous waste; primary hazardous waste were solvents, paints, and pesticides; included some EDB and "penta".
 - Nearly 2,000 photographs with 500 selected for Regional library.
 - Identified nearly 1,500 general and specific action items, to improve compliance
 - Surveyed over 160 different locations and hundreds of buildings and sites in 7 forests.
 - Visited concessionaires and permittees.
 - Covered over 15 million acres.
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- Over 90% (est.) hazardous waste was found to be legacy waste.
 - Nearly every facility *could* be a *non-hazardous* waste generator.
 - General lack of HazCom plans and implementation.
 - Minor pollution prevention planning or activities.
 - General need for district-level environmental recordkeeping.
 - General need for hazardous material management.
 - General need to improve concessionaire/permittee environmental awareness.




