Nature High Summer Camp (NHSC) has engaged and educated hundreds of Utah teens for the past 20 years.

The week-long camp takes place at the Great Basin Environmental Education Center, near Ephraim.





What happens at NHSC?

High school students from all over Utah participate in daily field trips and learning activities led by agency experts.

The campers gain hands-on experience in a wide variety of areas such including ecology, soil science, and hydrology.

Camp is divided into 5 user groups, and the students apply their new knowledge by evaluating real-world land management scenarios.

Work: 5 college students are hired as counselors




NHSC Schedule of Activities

Encouraging Healthy Lifestyles


A local caterer provides 3 nutritious meals every day.

Forest Service agreement and MOU


Campers are signed up as volunteers

Each agency contributes between \$2500- \$5,000 Funding covers:

- Counselor salaries
- Facility rental
- Catering
- Supplies for team games, instructors, campers
- First aid kits
- T-shirts, water bottles, hats

Most costs are in-kind. The partners' salaries are paid by their agencies, and fleet vehicles are used for transportation.
