What is Take It Outside!?



- Take It Outside! is BLM's flagship youth engagement program
- Stresses health, family, fun, and stewardship
- Provides opportunities for young people to engage in outdoor recreation, non-formal education, and volunteer projects, while fostering future generations of public land stewards



What defines a Take It Outside Activity?

- Any activity that gets kids outdoors, active on BLM lands
- Meets one or more TIO criteria of health, family, fun, and stewardship - outdoor recreation, non-formal education, and volunteer projects





If I don't receive BLM funding can my activity still be considered TIO?

- Yes! Many activities meet criteria of TIO but only a few receive funding through youth program.
- Even if you don't receive youth funding, report your activity in annual youth data collection for accomplishment reporting



Budget Updates

- 2014 youth funding included in state's base funding for recreation – spending decisions made at state level for allocation to field
- 2015 President's budget shows slight increase for youth – however, too early to count on anything
- 2015 Youth allocation likely go to states same as 2014 in base funding- spending at discretion of states.
- **2015 BPS** (last year for BPS) It is up to states to continue using it in 2015. Most states are using BPS in 2015 WO will not be reviewing individual project submissions such as TIO, Hands on the Land.
