

Basic Instructions for Module 1

Directions

Each step or stage in this tutorial will contain information in text areas this one. These areas will contain discussion on how WEPP works, what is the purpose for what you are doing, and what to do to continue to the next step. These areas will also provide helpful shortcuts and pieces of advice to assist you when you begin your own simulations. During this tutorial, more information may be present than can fit in one small area. When this happens, you will see scroll

Types of Input

During this tutorial, you will be required to perform a number of actions to go to the next step. Primarily this will be one type of mouse click (as describe to the left). But, you will also need to enter text, check a checkbox, select a item from a combobox, or choose a radio button.

This is a Combobox

You will be asked to enter or change some text in a box like this

- <-You can check/uncheck this bo
 - You can choose this Radio Butt
 - or this one, but not bott
- This is only one example of a butt

Single-Click

When you are instructions to "Click" in a particular location, you need to perform a single mouse click; that is, press down on the left mouse button and then release.

Double-Click

A Double-click is two single mouse clicks in rapid succession. Please note, that this is a rapid series of clicks; depending on your speed or if you moved the mouse between clicks, you may not be able to go to the next

Right-Click

A Right-click is a single mouse click using the RIGHT mouse button instead on the left. In WEPP, as you will see shortly, brings up a special pop-up menu. In this tutorial, when asked to perform a right-click, you will go to the next step in the lesson; when this occurs a pop-up menu for the

Left-handed Mouse Users

The above instructions assume the mouse you are using is set up for a right-handed user. If you are left-handed, just substitute "right" for left and "left-click" for "right-click" in the
