

## Improving and Sustaining Tribal Relations (1780-06)



**Description:** This course offers guidance on the implementation of BLM Manual MS 1780 “Tribal Relations” and its accompanying handbook H-1780-01 “Improving and Sustaining BLM-Tribal Relations.”

The course has two slide presentations (for line managers or resource specialists) and three videos offering examples of government-tribal partnerships and on-going consultation efforts. The course will take approximately 1 hour to complete.

**Objective:** Through examples of government-tribal partnerships and slide presentations, participants will learn their responsibilities for maintaining tribal relationships and understand the perspective of Indian tribes regarding consultation under the new guidance.

**Target Audience:** BLM line managers and resource specialists with responsibilities in tribal coordination and consultation.
