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# What is a Site?

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Management Actions are required to:

- provide a specific recreation setting or activity opportunity,
- protect resource values, or
- provide visitor safety.

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Management Actions = you pay attention to the area with actions such as:

- ranger patrols,
- trash clean-ups,
- visitor counts, or
- resource damage monitoring.



can decide if a site should be included in the database.

You do not have to include all sites in the RMIS Database.

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## **Three types of Sites**

- Developed Site – (permanent, sig. invest.),
- Minimal Development Site – (limited investment)
- Undeveloped Sites – (no facilities but visitor use is monitored).



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
# Things to Remember

- May or may not include minimal developed and undeveloped sites - User decides.
- Use at minimal developed and undeveloped sites can be accounted for in the “Dispersed Site.”

  - Formulas created from site page are not automatically copied to the Master List
  - Most users never copy the formulas to Master List

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# Adding Visitor Use to a Site

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# RMIS Database tracks recreation use associated with BLM lands

- Allows adding visits in many ways
  - Sites
  - Corridor segments (rivers, roads, trails, area designations)
  - SRPs
- Ultimately all use is tied to a specific site or sites (including the “dispersed site.”)

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When visitor use is added, a record is created – **“Journal Entry”**

Journal Entry displays:

- When data was entered
- Amount of use added
- Formula applied

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**View Visitor Use Entries**

**Edit or Delete Visitor Use**

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# “I want to Delete a Site”

- Ask yourself – “Why do I want to delete this site?”
  - Site has been destroyed or site was used for collecting river/trail use - Make Site **“Inactive”**
  - RMA boundary changed – Need to delete site and create a new one - **Move Site** function
  - Site has been decommissioned or transferred to different agency - Make Site **“Inactive”**
  - Playing around with program and made a new site by mistake - Delete Site
