Webinar Schedule



October 17, 2013: Erie Marsh Preserve coastal wetland restoration and enhancement. Presented by Christopher A. May, TNC. Chris May will discuss restoration efforts on the 945 acres of coastal wetlands in Erie Marsh Preserve, western Lake Erie.



November 14, 2013: Dune restoration at Humboldt Bay National Wildlife Refuge. Presented by Andrea Pickart, FWS. Andrea Pickart will discuss efforts to restore dune habitats in Humboldt Bay National Wildlife Refuge in Northern California.



December 18, 2013: Navigating state regulatory arenas: Differing approaches for permitting river restoration. Presented by Serena McClain, American Rivers. Methods of dam removal vary greatly and this webinar will discuss the reasons for this variability, focusing on the affect the regulatory environment can have on project implementation.




January 22, 2014: Restoration of western oak woodlands and savannas. Presented by David Ross, DOI, Marko Bey, Lomakatsi Restoration Project and CalLee Davenport, FWS. This webinar will discuss the ongoing partnership to restore the oak woodlands and savannas along the California-Oregon border, an umbrella habitat for a suite of neotropical birds and listed T&E plants.



February 11, 2014: Technical, cultural, and legal challenges associated with implementing four barrier removal projects on a high priority tributary to the Taunton River in Taunton, Massachusetts. Presented by Beth Lambert, Massachusetts DER and Cathy Bozek, TNC. This webinar will present the project objectives, highlight major challenges/solutions and share preliminary results.



March 12, 2014: Expanding living shorelines within the ACE Basin NERR to protect habitat and to reduce climate change vulnerability through the application of collaborative science-based habitat restoration. Presented by Dr. Peter Kingsley-Smith, South Carolina DNR. Dr. Kingsley-Smith will present an overview of a current project implementing multiple oyster reef habitat restoration and enhancement strategies at sites throughout the ACE Basin NERR in South Carolina.



April 15, 2014: Examination of reclamation using a geo-database: A framework for future decision management. Presented by Dr. Peter D. Stahl, University of Wyoming. Dr. Stahl will present his database framework that was constructed as a restoration decision management tool to identify successful restoration practices.



May 7, 2014: Riparian restoration along the Colorado River in Grand Canyon National Park: Success and challenges of a pilot watershed stewardship project. Presented by Melissa McMaster, NPS. This webinar will discuss various methods of riparian restoration for enhancing wildlife habitat and enriching the overall visitor experience.
