So those are the highlights of the Endangered Species Act's minor provisions

I've sought to acquaint you with many of the smaller, yet still important, sections of the Act, as well as where you can obtain more information about them. We've looked at four specific sections of the Endangered Species Act.

Let's do a quick review.

Section 6 outlines cooperation between the Federal Government and the states and territories in the conservation of listed and candidate species. Cooperative agreements and state grants fund land acquisition, surveys, planning documents, and outreach and education.

Sections 8 and 8A provide our authority in foreign countries for endangered species conservation and cooperation under international treaties. Funds are provided for training, research, and law enforcement.

In Section 17, we learned how the Endangered Species Act interacts with the Marine Mammal Protection Act, which often has more stringent prohibitions.

If you work with – or for -- state agencies ... if you study animals and plants in other countries ... if you are a marine biologist ... then Sections 6, 8, 8A, and 17 are vital to your understanding of how the Endangered Species Act works.
