As set out in the Department of the Interior, Environment and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2012, Forest Service land exchanges, where the value of the Federal parcel is greater than \$500,000, are submitted to you in accordance with the notice provisions. I have reviewed and recommend moving forward with the proposed Red Lodge Mountain Land Exchange. This exchange is located on the Custer-Gallatin National Forest within Carbon County, Montana. This land adjustment involves exchange of 382.45 acres of non-Federal land for 250.23 acres of Federal land. Appraisals on the exchange have not yet been completed, but it is anticipated the value will exceed \$500,000. The Forest Service proposes to proceed with the exchange to meet the long-term resource management objectives of landscape consolidation and secure public access on three Forest System trails, increasing recreation access opportunities.

I have enclosed a map of both the Federal and non-Federal parcels and a copy of the Notice of Exchange Proposal.



FOREST SERVICE Land Exchange Notice

Proposed Red Lodge Mountain Land Exchange

AG/JMA Red Lodge Realty Holdings, L.L.C., owners of Red Lodge Mountain Ski Resort, and the Forest Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, are considering an exchange of lands of approximately equal value under authority of the Act of March 20, 1922 (42 Stat. 465, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 485, 486); the Act of October 21, 1976 (90 Stat. 2743; 43 U.S.C. 1715-1717) and the Act of August 20, 1988 (102 Stat. 1086; 43 U.S.C. 1716 (note), 751 (note)).

The lands considered for exchange are located within the Custer Gallatin National Forest in Carbon County, Montana. The Federal lands are described as: P.M.M., T.7 S., R. 19 E., Section 26: N½NW¼SE¼; Section 25: SW¼SE¼NE ¼, SW¼NE¼, S½NW¼NE¼, S½N½NW¼, E½NE¼SW¼, SW¼NW¼SE¼, N½NW¼SE¼, and NW¼NE¼SE¼, consisting of 250.23 total acres, more or less. The Non-federal lands are described as: P.M.M., T. 7 S., R.19 E., Section 22: S½ SE¼; Section 26: S½NE¼SE¼; Section 27: E½NE¼, NE¼SE¼; and Section 35: NE¼, consisting of 382.45 total acres, more or less.

The proposed exchange would consolidate ownership of intermingled AG/JMA and national forest system lands. Also, AG/JMA would grant permanent easements to the U.S. to enhance public recreation use on three national forest system trails. The Forest Service is analyzing this proposal under applicable laws, regulations and policies. A decision to complete the exchange will be based on overall public interest.

The Federal lands have been segregated from appropriation under the mineral laws and public land laws. In the exchange, the U.S. would acquire approximately 7.2 acres of floodplain/wetland area and convey approximately 11.4 acres of floodplain/wetland area.
